Dr. Antonia Pantoja Youth leadership and Service Award

Eligibility & Guidelines

Dr. Antonia Pantoja--1922-2002

"I have a responsibility that is self-imposed. It's a responsibility to teach people who are like me, who are poor people who have no understanding of the fact that they can produce wealth."

Dr. Antonia Pantoja, born in San Juan, Puerto Rico in 1922. Studied at the University of Puerto Rico where she obtained her teaching credentials in 1942. Upon graduating from the University of Puerto Rico, she worked as a schoolteacher for two years in Puerto Rico where she cultivated a profound interest in education and addressing the needs of disadvantaged children.

Her most notable contribution-the creation of ASPIRA in 1961. This was the result of considerable hard work and collaboration with educators and social work professionals who shared her concern with the high dropout rate of Pue1to Rican youth in New York City during the ·50s and ·60s. ASPIRA flourished into a major national organization dedicated to empowering communities and especially Puerto Rican youth to have a say in and control of their future. ASPIRA (which means aspire in Spanish) conveyed in its name the expectation that Puerto Rican youth could succeed if they dared to ASPIRE.

Purpose

In dedication to Dr. Antonia Pantoja, the Boricua Festival Committee, Inc. will recognize Puerto Rican youth for their commitment, achievements and whose work and service has made a significant impact on their community. He or she will be awarded with "Dr. Antonia Pantoja Youth Leadership and Service Award" at the Boricua Festival – Salsa at the Waterfront event on Saturday, June 27, 2020.

Eligibility

- 1. Be of Puerto Rican descent
- 2. Be between the ages of 17 to 21
- 3. Must be engaged in their volunteer work, either in a professional or voluntary capacity
- 4. Be enrolled in high school or an accredited college or university
- 5. Must be present at the Boricua Festival on Saturday June 27th or forfeit recognition

- 1. Tell us in a brief paragraph (500 words or less) why this young person should be selected as an awardee
